# STEM NEWS



Barkell Elementary STEM students have been learning about technology through a number of exciting activities. Preschool through 1st Grade students had their VEX 123 robots go on an Easter Egg hunt this week. Students used the touch buttons to code the robots to drive to an egg and bump into it with the robot. First grade students used coding cards to begin learning block based coding to control their robots. Fourth graders built their own Operation game. They designed their Operation game pieces and frame in Tinkercad, 3D-printed them, and then designed a circuit with the help of conductive aluminum foil that causes a light to light up when the tweezers touch the outer edge of the holes in their frame. Similar to the game operation, but with a light instead of a buzzer.



## K-5 STEM News




Kindergarten and first grade students created playground games for their VEX 123 robots to play with friends. The games included mazes, races, tag, hide and seek, and hopscotch. They thought it was fun to code the robots to play the games. Second graders are learning to use the VEX Go robot kits. One of the building challenges was to build bridges using the kits that were stable, had a way to get on and off easily, and would allow a boat to pass underneath. Fourth graders are building "Creature Bots". These are robots that move without wheels. Their robots will need to be able to traverse an obstacle course that will include going over and around objects in the STEM classroom.


