MSU Science Theater performed once again for our students. Through hands on activities, students learned about seismic waves by creating "earthquakes" by stomping their feet in the bleachers. Students then were able to see how strong of an "earthquake" they created by reading the seismograph MSU brought and projected on the wall. Other demonstrations included: sound wave demonstrations using a fire tube called a Theramin, a robotics coding demonstration, and an air pressure demonstration.








- All visitors must report to the office. Please do not go to the classroom once the day has begun.
