All students in Young Fives through fifth grade have been working together to code robots and to build electrical circuits. Fourth graders have been learning about Robotics Competition using our VEX Go robots. They built robots that would help score points on the Mars Math Mission field. Their team had to then strategize how to score the most points within 1 minute. They worked on driving and coding their robots and used math skills to measure distance in their codes. 

# Fourth Grade News





- Please remember to check the lost and found. We have quite a few unclaimed belongings.


