WHAT IS WIN TIME AT BARKELL?

WIN (What I Need) Reading and Math groups are a collaborative effort between Title I staff and classroom teachers. All students, based on data, are grouped in order to receive extra support in a specific area of need or for advanced study. These groups are flexible and change often to accommodate student growth. WIN groups create positive learning environments where students can work on targeted areas in reading and math with small groups of their peers.

DID YOU KNOW?

 Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.

 Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.

• Students can still fall behind if they miss just one or two days every few weeks.

• Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.



By working together, we can help our children develop a positive attitude toward school and attendance. Let's ensure they have the best chance for success!

HAVE BULLDOG POWER: TIPS TO ATTEND EVERY HOUR!

Did you know that regular attendance is key to your child's success in school? When children miss school, they miss valuable lessons and social interactions, making it harder to keep up with their classmates. Even a few absences can impact their ability to learn and feel confident in their skills.

HERE ARE FIVE HELPFUL TIPS FOR BETTER ATTENDANCE:

1. **Set a Routine:** Create a consistent morning and bedtime routine. Children do the best with structure, so having consistent and predictable times for waking up, getting ready, and going to bed can make mornings easier for everyone.

2. **Morning Motivation:** Start the day with something fun! Play their favorite song during breakfast or have a little dance party to kick off the day with energy and excitement.

3. **Prepare Together:** Involve your child in preparing for school the night before. Let them pick out their clothes and pack their backpacks, making it feel like a fun activity rather than a chore.

4. **Celebrate Good Attendance:** Recognize and celebrate your child's attendance. A simple reward, like extra playtime or a special treat, can encourage them to keep it up.

5. **Keep Communication Open:** Stay in touch with teachers to understand any challenges your child might be facing. Working together can help find solutions and support your child's attendance.

The 4th grade classes explored McLain's State Park this month. They learned to identify trees and played a fun water cycle game.








BARKELL ELEMENTARY CHOIR
